

b) Members Concerns

It was noted that Penyparc Rd had flooded again recently Penyclawdd area potholes had been filled in many cases but some still remained. Cllr Phillips is awaiting a meeting with Mark Watkins concerning Penyparc. The Clerk will write to him.

It was noted that there had been no flooding at Barton Bridge despite recent heavy rain.

2034. Commons

It was agreed that the Clerk would write to Mr Jonathan Stephens, copy to Lord Raglan, to arrange a meeting to discuss the transfer of the keepership of the commons.

2035. Dog Fouling. Concerns were expressed about this problem. It was agreed that the Clerk would find out what was available in the way of signs and leaflets. It was also agreed that he would write to the dog warden to ask for an early or late visit to the community to pick up on dog walkers with dogs off the lead in the village. The use of the sports field for this purpose was also to be identified to the warden.

2036. Members Reports

Cllr D Watkins noted that he was now classed as an "additional governor" at the school. It was suggested that this is wrong as he is the minor authority representative.

Cllrs Brown and Phillips had attended the County Connections meeting. This had been disappointing. The general view from attendees was that there was no change in the County's attitude to working with other authorities. This had been confirmed by discussion at a subsequent One Voice Wales Meeting.

Cllr Parry noted that he had not been invited to any Llangovan Charity meetings He will ask Rev Guest about it.

Cllr Phillips noted that he had attended a One Voice Wales meeting about Post Office Closures. Fortunately there are none proposed in this area at present.
